**2 Chronicles 24:23-27**

### **I. Chapters 25: The Challenge of Selective Obedience (Luby’s Cafeteria)**

**INTRODUCTION:** (vs. 1-4) Joash’s son, Amaziah, becomes king after the assassination of his father. Once his rule over Judah is firmly established he killed those who had killed his father. But he did the right thing by not executing the assassins’ children. For God’s law forbade holding children responsible for their parents’ sin.

**A. The Campaign Against Edom, (vs. 5-17)**

1. Amaziah raises an army, (vs. 5-10)

a. (v. 5), *“Amaziah assembled Judah ... and took a census of those from 20 years old and upward....”*

b. (v. 6), *“He hired also 100k valiant warriors out of Israel for 100 talents of silver.”*

2. Amaziah Defeats the Edomites, (vs. 11-13)

a. (vs. 11-12), *“Amaziah strengthens himself ... struck down 10,000 of the sons of Seir....”*

**Revelation 13:17**

3. The gods of the Edomites Defeat Amaziah, (vs. 14-17)

a. (v. 14), *“Now it came about after Amaziah came from slaughtering the Edomites that he brought....”*

- b. Amaziah repudiates the man of God. (v. 16), *“And it came about as he was talking....”*

**Romans 2:1, 21-23**

**B. The Campaign Against Israel, (vs. 17-24)**

- 1. (v. 17), *“Then Amaziah king of Judah to counsel and sent to Joash...the king of Israel, saying....”*
  - a. This could be his response for the 3,000 Jews killed, or over-confidence after his victory over Edom.

- b. Two nations meet in battle, (v. 21), *“So Joash king of Israel went up, and he and Amaziah faced....”*
