### **I. The Challenge of Reconciliation, (2 Chronicles 30)**

#### **INTRO:**

#### **A. Preparing for Reconciliation, (vs. 1-12)**

1. King Hezekiah seeks reconciliation, (vs. 1-4)

- a. The king, in those days, presided over the physical AND spiritual welfare of the people.

2. The “Invitation,” (vs. 5-9)

- a. #1 – Your faithless families caused your current problems, (v. 7)

- b. #2 – Pride/humility have consequences, (v. 8)

- c. #3 – Reconciliation to God will improve your situation with your captors, (v. 9)

3. The “Response,” (vs. 10-12)

- a. Not all of God’s people desire to work towards reconciliation even though it is the will of God!!
