Be "The Encourager"

I believe most people appreciate it when they receive encouragement from others. Some examples include; "You are doing a great job!" "I really appreciate how you ____- !" "You are amazing!" "I've never



seen anyone _____ as well as you!" "Keep up the good work!"

These types of affirmations are important in the home, on the job, and especially with our Christian brothers and sisters. All believers need encouragement. For we recognize that each one of us is locked in a cosmic spiritual battle with an enemy who is seeking to destroy us! It is difficult enough to continue to live a faithful life. But without receiving encouragement from time to time many people grow weary and simply give up.

Jesus was an "encourager!" He would tell stories where people were encouraged. At the end of the parable of "The Talents," the faithful were told, "Well done good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Enter into the joy of your Master," (Matthew 25:21, 23). The other way we can encourage is through our actions. Some examples include; our attendance at services and events, or our jumping in to help with a ministry or project, or our support of our leaders; "Obey your leaders, submit to them; for they keep watch over your souls as those who will give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with grief, for this would not be profitable to you," (Hebrews 13:17).

As we all like to be encouraged, choose to be the encourager for others – we all need it!!!

New Convert Class for the YOUth: The Need for Authority

Generally speaking, Joey asked the class, "How would you define the word 'standard'? Or what is an example of a standard?" Some said, "A standard is like certain people playing on the offensive line." In other words, someone skinny and with long arms would not be an offensive lineman. That type of person would typically play wide receiver or defensive back. The coach would only allow bigger players to play on the line because that position has a specific standard for playing and winning the game.



Likewise, God has a specific standard. He had one since the beginning of time. For instance, God's standard for Adam and Eve was to eat from any tree in the Garden of Eden beside one (Genesis 2:16-17). They went beyond the standard God set for them by eating from the tree of knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 3:1-6). Handing out consequences to Adam and Eve resulted in their falling short (Genesis 3:16-19). The same thing happened to their children, Cain and Abel (Genesis 4:1-5).

In **Leviticus 10:1-2**, Aaron's sons, Nadab and Abihu, did not live up to God's standards. They offered strange fire before the Lord. God did not command that type of fire. Death was the consequence of their actions. The same principle can be seen in the life of Uzzah. In **2 Samuel 6**, as the Ark of the Covenant was about to tip over, Uzzah protected it by catching its fall. However, God had specific instructions on who could touch the Ark (**Numbers 4:15; 1 Chron. 15:13-14**). Because that standard was not met, Uzzah died.

The Bible is God's Standard. It is the truth (John 17:17; Psalm 119:160) and must be lifted above all sin (1 Timothy 3:15). Those who wrote down that truth were holy men of God (2 Peter 1:20-21). They made no mistakes. The words they wrote did not come from their mind. God must define the interpretation of those words. They came from His mouth (2 Timothy 3:16). Some of those holy men of God who wrote those words were Jesus apostles and prophets (Ephesians 2:20; 3:1-5).

Every time they wrote and taught, they wrote down and taught the authority of Christ. They knew what consisted of His authority when they were empowered by the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8). The Spirit of truth would help them remember what Jesus said (John 15:26) and guide them into all truth (John 16:13). While they wrote and taught, they loosen and bind some things that were already loosed and bound in heaven (Matthew 16:19). Anyone who did not uphold to the apostles' teaching was to be avoided (2 Thess. 3:14). Therefore, the authority of the Bible must reflect in our words and actions (Colossians 3:17). If we do not live up to that standard, the consequence is spiritual death (Matthew 7:13-14, 21-23; Romans 6:23). Follow His instructions. They are clear. There is no excuse not to know what they are.
