There are eight (or nine) inspired writers of the New Testament. All of them wrote what the Holy Spirit instructed them to write, and each author's style/personality is observable in the text. The Bible is amazing, partly because people from such diverse backgrounds were able to write an intertwined account without contradictions or mistakes.

- Luke was a Gentile author that wrote 2 books, was a companion of Paul and was a physician by training.
- Paul wrote 13 books, was known as both Saul & Paul, he grew up in Tarsas as a devout Jew and a Roman citizen.
- John wrote 5 books and was a disciple that Jesus loved, and one of Jesus' inner circle.
- Matthew wrote 1 book and he left his life as a tax collector to follow Jesus.
- John Mark wrote 1 book and he accompanied Paul and Barnabas on their 1st missionary journey.
- The author of the book of Hebrews is not given and many authors have been suggested. The book was originally stored with the books of Paul.
- Peter wrote 2 books and was a fisherman that became one of the inner circle of the apostles.
- James wrote 1 book and was the half-brother of Jesus, who did not initially believe in Jesus, became a devout disciple after resurrection.
- Jude wrote 1 book and the half-brother of Jesus, he was also an unbeliever until after the resurrection of Jesus. H to H

Marshall Keeble was famous for saying "The word must is one of the strongest words in the English language."

If a young man should be killed while he and his fiancée are traveling to a preacher's house to get married, would they be married in God's eyes merely because they planned to be married?

While time is on our side, let us not deal in hypothetical ideas; instead, let us make immediate preparations to have our sins washed away (Acts 22:16).

"Strugglers" versus "Practitioners"

Only in heaven will everyone have their act together. This ain't heaven! Unfortunately, however, some of us have gotten pretty good at *appearing* to have our act together. It's no wonder why some who come seeking answers walk away from church frustrated! They look at us and don't think their lives will ever be where ours *appears* to be (you see, they don't know it's just an act).

I believe most people are either "strugglers" or "practitioners." The "strugglers" are those plagued by certain persistent temptations. They could be "struggling" with; drugs, alcohol, same sex attraction, pornography, lying, profanity, etc., etc. They may get past their "struggles" for a while. Then they relapse and hate themselves for it. They desperately want a life without "struggles."

"Practitioners," on the other hand have given up the struggle. They grew tired of the Yo-Yo lifestyle of "sin/guilt/repent ... sin/guilt/repent"! Now they believe their sin as just a normal part of who they are. They choose to no longer feel guilty and they resent those who seek to restore their relationship with God. Once "strugglers" know we won't (can't!) judge them, they may become more open to hear how Jesus can help! Then we can serve by encouraging them, (see **Hebrews 3:13**). We can allow them to hold us accountable as together we accept God's accountability. And yes, we remain committed to them even during a relapse! This is what God meant when He said, "Bear one another's burdens and thus fulfill the law of Christ," Galatians 6:2.

But what can we do for "practitioners"? PRAY! Just because we may not know how to help doesn't mean God's hands are tied. For as much as we love "practitioners," God loves them far more – and He won't give up on them. For in His providence, God will keep seeking to soften their hearts so they will let Him help. Who knows, one day a "practitioner" may come and say to you that they are "struggling" with some sin. Won't that be a great day!!!



Sometimes a situation arises when we have to make a decision as to who do "I thank". When several people are involved, it can be difficult to pick out that one person who needs thanking more than the others. Thanksgiving to

One of the Bible's indictments against rebellious humanity is that "although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him" (Romans 1:21). An ungrateful heart is a heart that is cold toward God and indifferent to His mercy and love. It is a heart that has forgotten how dependent we are on God for everything.

From one end of the Bible to the other, we are commanded to be thankful. In fact, thankfulness is the natural outflowing of a heart that is attuned to God. The psalmist declared, "sing to the **Lord with thanksgiving"** (Psalm 147:7). Paul wrote, "always be thankful" (Colossians 3:15). A spirit of thanksgiving is always the mark of a joyous Christian.

Why should we be thankful? Because God has blessed us richly, and we should be thankful for each blessing.
