Mark 12:41-44

I. What the Widow Gave, (Mark 12:41-44)

- **A.** Mark 12:41 "And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much."
 - Jesus intentionally positions Himself to observe people's lives . . .
 a. Samuel, the prophet, was told to anoint one of the sons of a man with 7 sons.

- **B.** Mark 12:42, "And there came a certain poor widow, and she put in two small copper coins, which amount to a cent/lepta."
 - 1. The widow's offering was insignificant in worldly terms but immense in God's eyes.

2. Unlike the self-sufficient, wealth-focused people of her time, this woman depended totally on God.

- **C.** Mark 12:43, "And calling His disciples to Him, He said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the contributors to the treasury."
 - 1. Jesus highlights the widow's offering as greater than all the others combined. Why?

- **D.** Mark 12:43b-44, "For they all put in out of their surplus; but she, out of her poverty, pt in all that she owned, all she had to live on.
 - 1. The widow's giving was total.
