I. The Scourging:
A. Roman scourging involved a whip called a <u>flagrum</u> with lead weights, pieces of bone and metal.
1. Isaiah 53:5 , "But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities"
1 Peter 2:24
II. The Crown of Thorns: A. John 19:2-3, "And the soldiers wove a <u>crown of thorns</u> and put it on His head"
1. Thorns represent the curse from the fall
Genesis 3:18
1 Timothy 6:15
Galatians 3:13
III. The Carrying of the Cross: A. John 19:17, "So they took Jesus, and he went out, bearing his own cross"
1. Carrying a cross meant total shame and public rejection. It declared a person's guilt and defeat.

IV. The Nails:
A. Colossians 2:14, "having cancelled out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us and which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross."
1. Roman crucifixion used nails as a final, irreversible sentence. It says, "This one is finished."

V. The Cry: "It Is Finished!" – A. John 19:30, "When Jesus therefore had received the sour wine, He said, 'It is finished!' 1 The words, "It is finished" are translated from the Greek term, "Tetelestai (τετελεσται)."
